

In September 2003 I moved to Bamako, the capital of Mali, in West Africa, after 8 years of preparation. I started teaching German at a local, secular High School, which allowed me to get to know a lot of people.

Emmanuel just started his studies in Bamako, and joined me for weekly meetings at my apartment. Simeon, one of my neighbors, dedicated his life to the Lord in November, and has been growing ever since. My colleague Alice started reading my Christian books and accepted Jesus before returning to France in May. And during my last few weeks, my student Simon-Pierre got more and more interested in knowing Jesus, having read some of my books. And Aisha - she was the first person I met, and she keeps visiting. Simeon is now taking her to church on Sundays.



## Looking Forward



At Easter we went to where the people are to show them God's love practically. We bought tins of powdered milk (which is what everyone uses here) and wrote on it "Jesus loves you. God bless you." Then we went from house to house, introducing ourselves and Jesus, blessing them with the milk and praying for the sick.

People are disillusioned, they are suffering, and when they see the power of God who heals and loves them, they turn to Him. We are going to do these outreaches on a regular basis.

And we want to do them in concentric circles around the location of the church, that all may know "where God lives" and where they can go to find prayer and help and salvation through Jesus.

We now have to find the right place – either buying a piece of land and building a simple structure on it, or finding the right place to rent (which is more difficult).

There is actually a Christian on whose property we might be able to build. Please pray that God will show us the place He has prepared – and we can have confidence that He will provide the means to buy/build or rent.





The biggest need now is a car – a pick-up truck like the one on the left, without which many roads would be unpassable during rainy

Besides being able to move around freely, a car will allow us to also go into the villages to preach the gospel and pray for the sick.


## Other Projects
