# MALI



- ü In the 10/40 window in the heart of West Africa.
- ü Former French colony.
- ü Twice the size of Texas.
- ü Third-poorest nation in the world.
- ü Average annual income \$190.
- ü Two thirds (semi)desert.
- ü Two thirds farming.
- ü Two thirds of its 13 million people under the poverty line.
- ü Only Muslim nation with religious freedom.
- ü 90% Muslim, 9% pagan.
- ü Half the population under 15.
- ü Child sacrifices, trafficking, forced labor.
- ü Life expectancy 47 years.
- ü Women and children not valued.
- ü 1.5 out of 4 children never turn 5.
- ü Polygamy, female circumcision, forced child marriage.
- ü Few churches, and often dead.



# STREET CHILDREN

The capital of Bamako has thousands of street children whose existence the government denies. Every Muslim family gives one boy away to a Muslim teacher - often when they are only 5 years old - where they have to memorize the Quran at night, and beg for money during the day. They don't get food and get beaten frequently. Many of the boys run away from their teachers fighting to survive on the streets.



We go on the streets once a week to feed them and invite them to our weekly program, where they not only

get a meal, but have fun, hear the gospel, receive prayer, medical attention and clothes when needed.

Those who want to get off the streets and live for Jesus are taken in as our own children. We have 5 teenagers now, and as soon as we have more space, more will follow.
