STREET CHILDREN

The capital of Bamako has thousands of street children whose existence the government



denies. Every Muslim family gives one boy away to a Muslim teacher – often when they are only 5 years old - where they have to memorize the Quran at night, and beg for money during the day. They don't get food and get beaten frequently. Many of the boys run away from



their teachers fighting to survive on the streets. Every night we pick them up at the bus station and take them home for a meal, and a safe place to spend the night.

Once a week we have a special program, where they not only get a meal, but have fun, hear the gospel, receive prayer, medical attention and

clothes when needed.

Those who want to get off the streets and live for Jesus, are taken in as our own children.



We have 8 children now, and as soon as we have more space and workers, more will follow.
