- One planted in Dra in Nov 2008



Our goal is to plant a strong base church in every one of the eight regions in Mali. That base church then takes responsibility to

expand God's kingdom into their whole region by planting churches in every village by means of movies, preaching, signs, miracles and wonders.

On our base we will raise up and train church planters to go out and expand God's kingdom.

MALI

- In the 10/40 window in the heart of West Africa.
- Former French colony.
- Twice the size of Texas.
- Twelfth-poorest nation in the world.
- Average annual income \$190.
- Two thirds (semi)desert.
- Two thirds farming.
- Two thirds of its 13 million people under the poverty line.
- Only Muslim nation with religious freedom.
- 90% Muslim, 9% pagan.
- Half the population under 15.
- Child sacrifices, trafficking, forced labor.
- Life expectancy 47 years.
- Women and children not valued.
- 1.5 out of 4 children never turn 5.
- Polygamy, female circumcision, forced child marriages.
- Few churches, and often dead.



STREET CHILDREN

The capital of Bamako has thousands of street children whose existence the government



denies. Every Muslim family gives one boy away to a Muslim teacher - often when they are only 5 years old - where they have to memorize the Quran at night, and beg for money during the day. They don't get food and get beaten frequently. Many of the boys run away from



their teachers fighting to survive on the streets. Every night we pick them up at the bus station and take them home for a meal, and a safe place to spend the night.

Once a week we have a special program, where they not only get a meal, but have fun, hear the gospel, receive prayer, medical attention and

clothes when needed.

Those who want to get off the streets and live for Jesus, are taken in as our own children.



We have 9 children now, and as soon as we have more space and workers, more will follow.
